Annual Report - FY 04

The tenth year of activity for the Friends (April 1, 2003 to March 31, 2004) was a somewhat challenging one. Community Center construction prevented us from using our usual highly-visible site on the library lawn for book sales, leading to a reduction in income from those sales. We also lost our off-site book storage space, which had previously been provided by Columbia Union College, requiring us to use members' basements to store books in preparation for the sales. Memberships and membership revenues are down, which could have a number of causes but is undoubtedly a problem we need to address in the new year. One potential cause is the resignation of our newsletter editor partway through the year, resulting in decreased contact with the membership.

On a more positive note, we still succeeded in raising over \$6300, due in part to the continuing generosity of Robert Patenaude and Doug Harbit, who invited us to hold a silent auction at the Davis Warner Inn again this year. As before, many Takoma Park businesses participated by donating merchandise and gift certificates.

The Friends funded nearly \$3600 in programming at the library this year, continuing our sponsorship of the Summer Quest summer reading program, the College Bound program, ESL classes, and numerous other events throughout the year. We have also committed to purchasing a digital camera for the library, a new bookshelf for the children's room, and two additional computers during the coming year.

I am very grateful for the support of the rest of the Board as I conclude my second year as President, and am optimistic for the future of the organization.

I would also like to express my appreciation for the membership—your support for our community library has been even more important in the current fiscal climate. Thank you!
