helping at our two annual book sales or ensuring that the little-free-libraries are appropriatedly stocked. Board member Walter Mulbry constructs and installs most of the Friends little-free-libraries. The FTPML Spring and Fall Book Sales expand access to books by selling donated books at extremely reasonable prices. Money earned is then used for library programs. The board is sometimes the first funder for a new initiative such as funding the availability of e-books.



FTPML brings special speakers to the library for our annual membership meeting, the Great Big Book Club and other events. Board member Tim Rahn reports that one of his most satisfying projects was arranging last year's annual meeting talk by Jeff Bartholet on the Nuba Mountains in South Sudan and the people served by "Dr. Tom".



With backing from the Friends, the Library offers a weekly Spanish Circle Time and a monthly French Circle Time, both of which draw large crowds of young children and adults.
